

ERASMUS +, THE MOBILITY PROGRAMME FOR ALL!

Do you feel like going to study, to work or simply to train abroad? Or are you looking for funds to set up a project with the youth? That is what the Erasmus + programme is here for!

BUT, WHAT IS ERASMUS +?

Usually, the programme is known as a means for students to go study abroad. Indeed, any young person enrolled in higher education (university, institutes, but also undergraduate certificate programmes etc.) can, right from 2nd year, go to one of the 33 countries in the programme (the 28 Member States + 5 partner countries). Caution, the destinations vary depending on your institution, and scholarship varies depending on the destination. You can also apply for scholarship if you are going for internship at a company in one of the 33 countries.

JUST FOR STUDENTS?

No! If you are an apprentice or a student in a professional high school, this programme is for you as well! You can go to a company, an organisation or any other educational institution in Europe. Secondary and high school students can also benefit from the programme! All it takes is for your institution to have a partnership with another academic institution. You can go alone (min. 14 years old) and be hosted by a family, or with your class to meet students who have worked on the same project as you.

AND OUTSIDE STUDIES?

If you are aged between 17 and 30 years old, you can engage in the **European Voluntary Service (EVS)** within a non-profit organisation that deals with all sorts of issues: the environment, health, fight against discrimination, etc. The **European Solidarity Corps** also exists since 2016, designed to surpass the EVS by opening the programme to internships and also to help you find a job or apprenticeship in the solidarity sector.

If you are looking for a job, you can also go for **internship at a company in Europe** through Erasmus +, by registering at the Pôle Emploi job agency. If you are a young graduate, you can also benefit from it at the end of your studies, but you must submit your application while you are still registered at your institution.

JUST FOR THE "YOUTH"?

Neither! If you are a **trainer or teacher**, you can also benefit from the programme in order to meet your peers in other European countries and share ideas with them, or even create partnerships.

ERASMUS +, A FINANCIAL PACKAGE TO FUND YOUR PROJECTS!

The programme also allows your academic institution or your association, sports club, etc. to fund projects that aim to enhance idea sharing among young Europeans.

APART FROM ERASMUS +, IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE?

Only the Erasmus + programme enables you to go abroad. Here are a few examples: Civic Service Abroad, International Voluntary Service at a company or in administration (VIE/VIA), the Eurodyssey programme, etc.
